Letter from the Board of Directors

Donors, Friends:

It is our pleasure to present the 2015 Annual Report. The following includes wonderful news of the graduation of our first year's intake, plus other positive updates from the year past. In this opening letter, we also invite you to take a moment to reflect on the reality of the situations faced by our Amazing Girls – to understand just how impressive their achievements are.

Amazing Girls Class of 2015

2015 was a special year for the Amazing Maasai Girls Project: in December, our first intake of scholarship recipients graduated secondary school. These are the 15 Amazing Girls who you helped send to school in 2012, through the inaugural Amazing Maasai Marathon. We are enormously proud of the girls and ever grateful to you for your pivotal role in their achievements.

Having extended their education beyond primary school, our Amazing Girls were able to avoid the all-too-common fate of forced childhood marriage and pregnancy prevalent in Maasai communities. As reported by the [Global Education Fund](#), in Kenya “just over 23% of girls with only a primary school education are mothers compared to 10% of those who have a secondary school education or higher”. The girls are also now better informed and better positioned to say no to the illegal, dangerous and traumatizing practice of FGM (female genital mutilation) and to protect their younger sisters from the same. With their four-year secondary education, they will be able to seek further education and/or vocational skills, contributing to their family financially and helping break the cycle of poverty. You helped entirely reset their trajectories.

The next steps for our Amazing Girls are to await their exam results (out in February 2016), and then wait on the allocation of government-sponsored college places (September 2016) at which point, depending on outcomes, government bursaries and private funding can be sought to potentially further their education at the university level.

Financing university education is beyond the scope of the AMGP, but should anyone wish to discuss supporting our ambitious Class of '15 girls through college, please contact us. Regardless of next steps, the AMGP will work with each graduating girl to have them serve as ambassadors to the younger girls in our program and their wider community – to motivate and inspire, to give back.

For 2016, we are pleased to announce that we have awarded scholarships to 6 new Amazing Girls to begin their studies this month, and wish them much luck and support as they embark on the next stage of their education!



Amazing Maasai Marathon and Global Run 2015

Our 5th annual Amazing Maasai Marathon was held on August 8, 2015, and continues to be a highlight sporting event in the Laikipia North district and town of Kimanjo. What was particularly special about this year's race was that it saw the participation of AMGP co-founder Molly Fitzpatrick. Each of the Amazing Maasai Ultra/Amazing Maasai Marathon's major races have now been completed by each of the AMGP's directors: Paul Ark in the half marathon in 2014, Molly Fitzpatrick in the marathon in 2015, and Sarah Soulié in the ultra marathon in 2011!

This year, 182 runners from 9 countries ran in the marathon, half marathon, and 8km fun run. These numbers represent a decline from race attendance in previous years, the result of terrorism incidents that have occurred in various parts of the country and which have consequently depressed tourism across the country. However, given Kenya's natural beauty, rich wildlife reserves, and status as a training and racing destination of choice for distance runners around the world, we expect to see tourism (and AMM) numbers recover in the near future. On the same day that the Amazing Maasai Marathon was held, more than 1,200 individuals in 48 locations across 16 countries joined the 2nd annual Amazing Maasai Global Run, donating a 10km walk or run in support of girls' education in Kenya. The Global Run has proven a strong secondary source of scholarship donations and has greatly expanded the awareness and reach of AMGP's mission and activities. Our Team & Partnerships

2015 also saw two very positive updates for the AMGP. Firstly, we welcomed a Girls Mentor to our local team in Kenya: Agnes Mosiany. Agnes' role is to manage the day-to-day issues of our Amazing Girls and to develop an empowerment program offering practical and emotional guidance on non-academic issues (menstruation, sexuality, pregnancy, FGM etc.) – support that is typical unavailable at school or home. Agnes will also work to support our ever-exceptional Scholarship Coordinator (and local Race Director), Solomon Kimani.

Secondly, the AMGP formalized our partnership with local charity [OI-Lentille Trust](#) (OLT), run by local business owners and community heads, Gill and John Elias. Through this partnership, our two organizations have committed to working together to promote the education and empowerment of females in the local area of Kimanjo, Laikipia. We are extremely fortunate to have benefitted from the support and expertise of OLT since the inception of the AMGP and are excited to step into 2016 with our strengthened partnership. In December, four Amazing Girls attended OI-Lentille Trust's anti-FGM workshop, held in Kimanjo and attended by teenage girls, parents and village elders. Our Amazing Girls Teresia Meshame, Christine Simbale, Jane Kaparo and Samaria Monto joined the "Big Sister" group since they have already been circumcised. The AMGP will be organizing similar workshops during 2016, led by Girls Mentor, Agnes – more on this over the coming months.



The challenges of girls' education in Kenya

While school fees for each student cost an average of \$500/year, some of our girls need more financial support than others due to very difficult personal situations. Orphaned girls or those who don't have full support for their studies from family, for example, may no longer have housing available to them, or even a stable source of food. As an organization, we are committed to ensuring that each child is secured safely in school for the entire duration of her secondary education. In 2015, this involved covering the food and housing for a number of girls.

Below are details of just a few of the girls who have faced immense personal challenges, which helps put into perspective just how amazing their achievements are in light of the obstacles they have overcome in earning their education:

Consolata Safari

In June 2015, it came to our attention that Consolata's performance in Form 4 had been dropping. Upon investigation, we learned that her guardian was entirely unsupportive of her education and that Consolata had essentially been abandoned. As a result, she had been forced into activities such as charcoal burning to raise her personal effects monies. Consolata had not sought any help until questioned. Despite circumstances that couldn't be less conducive to study success, Consolata continued and has now graduated.

Juliet Sinoi

Juliet is from a very poor background and lived with her grandmother after her (single) mother passed away while Juliet was still in primary school. Despite this most difficult situation, Juliet remained in school and has just graduated. In her own words, on her AMGP scholarship: "With your support I felt secured and the gap of being an orphan was closed. That's why I am now standing with great pride to say that I am proud to be an Amazing Girl."

Jennifer Samaita

Jennifer also completed Form 4 this year, attending Kimanjo Mixed Secondary School. The AMGP has provided housing for Jennifer in previous years and continued to do so in 2015, since her family situation was unstable and unsupportive. Jennifer shared a house in Kimanjo with two other AMGP-sponsored girls.

It is because of these serious challenges that the AMGP have appointed our new Girls Mentor, as mentioned above. Agnes will work with each of the Girls on a regular basis, to ensure that personal issues such as those of the girls above can be addressed as early and as fully as possible, and to avoid having their academic performance compromised as a result.



Financial Status

2015 was a challenging year for the AMGP financially. We raised over US\$31,000 in additional scholarship funds in 2015, bringing the cumulative scholarship funds raised since 2011 to over US \$157,000, though this represented a 13% drop in income over the previous year. Much of this decline can be attributed to donor fatigue; the AMGP has long relied on the generosity of small, individual donors, many who have given repeatedly over the five years of our existence. In 2016, it is critical that we find fresh and innovative strategies for reaching out to our existing donor base, as well as attract larger donors and corporate sponsors.

Concurrent with a drop in donation income, we also saw our expenses increase by 87%. Much of this can be attributed to inflation and higher tuition costs, additional education-related costs and programs specific to Form 4 students, and special circumstances discussed in the previous section of this letter. Also, we have been gradually reducing the number of scholarships to day schools Il Polei and Kimanjo Mixed Secondary Schools in favor of sending our Amazing Girls to St. Francis. Though the costs of boarding school are significantly higher, it also creates a more supportive environment conducive to academic achievement. Despite the increased expenditure and reduced profitability, the AMGP has always adopted a position of financial prudence, and as a result, these increased costs have been anticipated in our contingency budgets and will have minimal impact on our scholarship program's cash reserves.





For me, I would like to tell you that in my future I would like to be a doctor. I wish you a nice time and God bless for the work you are doing."






I am in St. Francis Girls and I am trying every way to pass my exams. I am glad that in this Maasai community, you have waken up to help us. May God bless you."





Finally, I wish you, Molly, and your friends a nice time and may God expand your territories in your life. Safe journey as you travel back to your country. Thank you."




